Personal Hygiene Pack

While we take appropriate measures in the school concerning hygiene, we suggest that you supply your child with a Personal Hygiene Pack. This is a bag or wash bag containing: A small towel or face towel, Alcohol gel, Tissues. The use of a Personal Hygiene Pack is a very effective way of taking care of personal hygiene. It is desirable that each child has a pack of tissues on his/her person at all times.

Indoor Shoes

All pupils 2nd to 6th of the school are requested to wear indoor shoes which are black plimsolls (Non marking soles).

Monies

All monies to be submitted through Aladdin.

<u>Appointments</u>

If you need to speak to a staff member please ring the school secretary Mary (0858747269) to make an appointment. Alternatively drop a line in your child's homework diary. It is not possible for a teacher to leave a class to speak with a parent, without having made prior arrangements for the class. The class teacher is always your first point of contact for issues relating to your child.

Labeling of Property

I would ask parents to label clearly all of your child or children's property, e.g. books, copies, pencils, pens, coats, shoes, slippers, sports gear, lunch boxes, etc. Every year we have lots of unclaimed property. Labelling would eliminate this!

School Uniform

PE Uniform to be worn by all students on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Formal Uniform to be worn on Tuesdays and Thursday except on days when GAA coaching is taking place.

Personal Accident Insurance

Our Board of Management has decided that all children in our school should have Personal Accident Insurance. The Board decided that we should ask all children in the school to take out 24 hour cover. Please remember that you can now claim all expenses incurred if your child has an accident anywhere, at any time, 24 hours per day, and 365 days a year. Payment link will be sent shortly by Aladdin. Please make payment of €8 per child to the school by Friday, 12th September. If you need to make a claim on this scheme, contact the school for the necessary form. Our experience in the past has been that Allianz Insurances pays promptly and without difficulty.

Board of Management

The Board of management are the overall managers of the school and meet throughout the year. There are 2 parents nominees, 2 community nominees, 2 patrons nominees (including the chairperson) 1 Teachers nominee and myself as Principal and Secretary to the Board.

The board works on a voluntary basis for a 4 year term. The current term finishes in November 2027 The nominees, while elected by various groups (parents, patron), do not represent those groups at Board of Management level, rather, they work together as a "Corporate Body", making decisions as a unit to the overall benefit of the school they serve.

Free School Meals

We have continued to communicate with the Department of Education on the roll out of hot school meals in Peterswell. We welcome the decision of the department over the summer to pause their initial method of roll-out and in the last week, introduce a more streamlined procurement and tendering process. We have now entered the procurement phase and the intention is to be in a position to begin hot school meals in January 2026. Thank you for your patience on this matter and I know you all appreciate the efforts made to ensure quality and nutritional value in what is offered here in Peterswell.
